The English program at Immaculata University acquaints students with important literary works, literary criticism, research skills, and non-print media. Students become proficient in written and spoken English, acquire tools to communicate effectively and are prepared to make a contribution in many careers.

DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES OFFERED

Bachelor of Arts in English -126 Credits

Certificate in Professional Communications – 18 Credits

Associate of Arts in English - 63 Credits

Certificate in Irish Studies – 12 Credits

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS BACHELOR DEGREE

All students are required to complete the following courses: Advanced Composition, Literary Analysis and Research, and English Seminar.

Students also select two courses from among the following: Major American Fiction, Twentieth Century British Authors, Modern Drama, Modern Poetry, Modern Women Writers I, and Modern Women Writers II.

Students choose a minimum of five courses from among English 300 level courses.

MAJOR REQUIREMENTS ASSOCIATE DEGREE

All students are required to complete the following courses: Advanced Composition, two courses from among Major American Fiction, Twentieth Century British Authors, Modern Drama, Modern Poetry, Modern Women Writers I, Modern Women Writers II, one 100 level literature course and two courses from among the 300 level courses.

EDUCATION CERTIFICATIONS

While working toward the degree in English, students may obtain teacher certification in Early Childhood Education, Elementary Education, Elementary/Special Education, or Secondary Education English. Please refer to the Education Certification requirements sheet which outlines the requirements to obtain teacher certification.

REQUIREMENTS CERTIFICATE IN IRISH STUDIES

All students are required to complete the following courses: Elementary Irish Language I, Irish Literature , and six credits from among Elementary Irish II, Irish Drama, History of Ireland, Irish Politics or Traditional Irish Dancing.

REQUIREMENTS CERTIFICATE IN PROFESSIONAL COMMUNICATIONS

All students are required to complete the following courses: Business and Technical Writing, Public Speaking, and twelve credits from among specified courses in communications, business and computer science.

Degrees and Certificates can be completed entirely in the evening.
