

Distance Education – State by State Approvals

The U.S. Department of Education, through the Higher Education Opportunity Act, requires institutions offering distance education programs to determine eligibility to offer those programs to students residing in other states.

Each state has specific regulations governing what institutions outside of their state must do in order to provide distance education experiences to its state's residents.

Immaculata University encourages any students whose primary residence is outside the state Pennsylvania to review the list below and confirm whether or not Immaculata is approved to provide distance education courses in their home state.

Immaculata may offer distance education courses/programs in the following states (either by having received specific permission to do so or because IU's offerings are exempt from needing approval based on the state's requirements):
