Preference will be given to applicants with a doctorate in clinical psychology from an APA-accredited program. ABDs may be considered with the expectation of degree completion prior to the start date. The applicant should possess expertise in clinical child psychology as demonstrated by predoctoral internship experience, postdoctoral training, scholarship, and/or professional work experience. Preferred applicants will have a license or be license-eligible. Demonstrated or potential excellence in teaching, scholarship, and clinical practice is expected. Candidates who work from a systems and/or developmental psychopathology perspective are especially encouraged to apply. Salary will be commensurate with experience.
